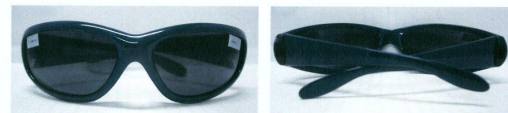

Avoid brown or grey / blue lenses as around 10% of boys and fewer girls are colour blind and these colours compound the problem.

We only use high impact resistant polycarbonate G-15 lenses that will take the punishment of every day use in schools and will not distort colour.

Frames

Most frames made in Asia are made from cheap plastics that break easily and are very heavy. Even some of the paint finishes have high levels of lead. Avoid frames that do not wrap close to the face with narrow sides especially with dark lenses - dark lenses open the pupil and if the eye is not covered from the side more UV light enters the eye causing serious damage.

We designed a light weight high impact resistant polycarbonate frame in a close fitting wrap around style with wide sides to eliminate UV from entering the eye.

Guarantee

Action 11.8a

Move accounts to Westpac from Commonwealth Bank

- This can be set up as two previous accounts already held with CBA
- Main issue will be around the EFTPOS terminal. Currently held with Westpac, if EFTPOS terminal remains at WBC then must hold a settlement account with WBC.
- Look into costing for CBA terminal. Several options but based on monthly turnaround. Currently not a set monthly amount, can range from \$3400- up to \$11,000. EFTPOS fees are based on \$\$ monthly turnaround. Current monthly fees on average are \$46, \$70 and over \$100 in June for last two years. June is due to Winter Uniform purchase and change in Uniform.
- If we look at changing accounts and EFTPOS terminal to CBA- fees structure is based on monthly rental plus turnaround. Monthly rental ranges from \$30- to up to \$150. If we look at a plan based on average turnover, monthly rental \$90 with a \$\$ turnaround of \$6K plus 1.5% fee on purchases over monthly turnaround.
- Currently with WBC we are on a no pricing plan structure.

We either leave accounts as is or change both Uniform Shop account and EFTPOS terminal.



Action 11.9a

Change CommBank Accounts to a CommBIZ account

- No changes required to accounts.
- We need to consider applying for the CommBiz which will allow easier payment system from CBA accounts. Currently needing two signatories to be present to allow any debits/payments to be processed.
- CommBiz will allow payments to be processed much easier using tokens or the CommBiz App.
- As we are a Not for Profit Organisation, I have been advised that there will be no transaction fees (normally 0.275c) Must provide proof of Not For Profit.
- Application to complete by signatories to establish facility.

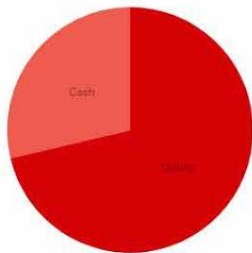

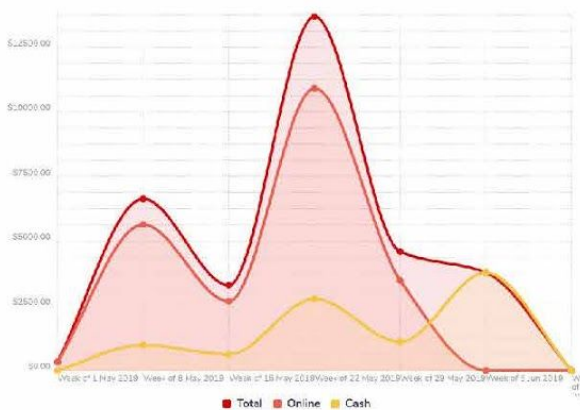

Amount Raised - Week by Week

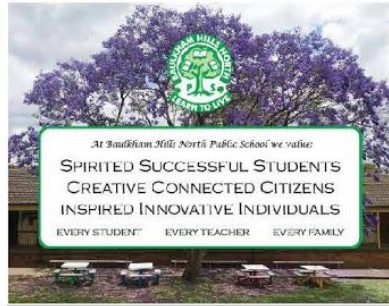

Business Arising

General Report

- 1) Big thank you for the Colour Run activity– a huge success and enjoyed immensely by the students.
- 2) Have secured parent reps for merit selection panels – thank you to Candice and Charmaine for volunteering to be on DP and CT panels respectively.
- 3) Playground Upgrade Update: Seniors playground is about to commence – DoE project manager working with ULP in development of contract – should be soon. Installation of sandstone structures in bottom playground to commence this week. School to commence building the Bush Tucker garden – Project Group of students and architects formed. Grant submitted to DoE for 2nd stage of wall area 1:1 funding. Submitted Community Building Partnership Grant for Shepherds Lane Entry - \$98,000 approx. Awning shelters over Kiss and Drop and Bus waiting areas being installed soon. Can we determine best time for Playground Upgrade committee to meet???
- 4) Re-Imagining Project – Flexible Learning Space Furniture Ordered – being delivered early July. Distributed SWAY on appropriate screen use to families – embedded Family Media Plan template.
